Cascade Brewers Guild Pub Crawl

Message from Lori Brown:

I just got an e-mail from Mike Hale yesterday and he needs to change the date to April 14th. We are still working out the details of which pubs we will go to, but the rough idea is to meet at Hales about 11:30 and have lunch, get on the bus and go to 3 or 4 other local pubs and then return to Hales about dinner time.

Cascade Brewers Guild Competition – The Cascade Brewer's Guild Competition is going to be held at Hales Ales Brewery St. Patrick's Day weekend, March 10 and 11. They're looking for help in the way of Stewards and Judge apprentices as well as entries (here's a blurb on it from Alan Hord):

"The competition is open to all BJCP judges, as well as non-certified and novice judges. We'll need stewards as well. There will be no less than 2 judges per table - one being a JCP judge. In the past we've always had no less than 150 entries - qualifying us as a regional competition. There have been no less than 13 flights. The competition typically takes 2 days because of space limitations. All entries, judges and stewards are encouraged to enlist using the Online Registration Wizard - which will be available 30 days before the competition. The BOS is done on Sunday - unless we can get everything done in one day. The winner is announced within 24 hours on the website - typically I post it that evening and notify the person (if they are not there at the competition) by phone or email. There will be a couple of booths for sponsors: Puterbaugh Farms has a really nice Hop representation!"

One beer, one mead, and one cider will be judged Best-of-Show (for each primary category). Winners shall receive a Best-of-Show ribbon plus additional awards and gifts. We are negotiating the terms for the Best-of-Show winning entry to be brewed by a local brewer or brewpub. Please check back for updated information. First, second and third place certificates will be awarded in each category or combined category. First place winners will receive a \$30 gift certificate, Second a \$20, and Third a \$10 if score was 35 points and above. Entrants scoring below 30 may not advance to the Best-of-Show round. Only one entrant per flight may advance. Advancement will be decided by the judging panel (may not be based on points in the case of a tie).
