

is Beautiful initiative is a collaborative
effort amongst the brewing community
and its customers, to bring awareness to
the injustices that many people of color
face daily. Its mission is to bridge the gap
that has been around for ages and
provide a platform to show that the
brewing community is an inclusive place
for everyone of any color.

More than 1,200 breweries from 50 states and 22 countries have signed on to support the project and brew Black Is Beautiful, a moderately-high ABV stout. AHA Governing Committee member and past Homebrewer of the Year Annie Johnson worked with Baskerville to scale the recipe down to a volume suitable for homebrewers.
