# **2023 Fresh Hop Competition**

The second annual GEBL Fresh Hop Best in Show Competition is coming up. We'll judge our own member entries at our October 9 meeting, with the best going forward to the broader competition on October 14 at Sound 2 Summit Brewery. This is your and our chance to get the Fresh Hop Competition Belt back!

### The rules are simple:

- 1. Beer must contain at least 50% fresh hops
- The term "Fresh Hops" refers to freshly harvested hops (per the BA Guidelines: Such hops might be undried fresh or frozen cones or ground material, or, freshly kilned dried cones or pellets)



- Other hops may be used in the beer but the primary flavor and/or aroma character of the hops MUST be from the current year's hop harvest.
- 2. Beer must be homebrewed (not commercial)
- 3. Beer can be any style

The October 14 competition will be judged using the 2021 Brewers Association Fresh Hop Guidelines.


I also take entries at my house (2105 Lombard Avenue, Everett) and there is a cooler on the back porch. Through Thursday, August 3rd.
