Big Brew 2023 will be this coming Saturday, May 6 at Scott & Ashleigh's place, 21826 72St SE, Snohomish WA 98290. The location is off Mero Rd just east of Storm Lake about 20 minutes from Sound 2 Summit Brewing. Signs will be posted at their driveway.

Start brewing at 9:00 am. The national toast to home brewing will be at 10:00 am, and a GEBL-only toast at 12:30 pm after which we'll begin the pot luck. Bring your brewing stuff (or just you if not brewing, but bring some of <u>your</u> home brew to share) and something to share for the pot luck.
