


The next meeting is Monday, July 14. We will judge IPA's.


GEBL Book Club By Lori Brown

The first thing you do at Beerstock is visit the check-in booth. There you get the all-important commemorative glass to hold a "check-in beer" and it only gets tastier from there. The registration process has evolved over the years. Watch your email for more details on the Beerstock Registration process. It is now a 501(c)/7 and so you have to register as a member with the Washington Stated Homebrewers Collective, pay dues (Beerstock fee) and sign a waiver, which is used for prize drawings.

Senate Bill 5060 passed in 2009, making it legal to transport and share homebrew in Washington State. "Yeah!! Let's get all the homebrew clubs in Washington together and celebrate!" thought a crazy group of homebrewers and that's how it all began. The first Beerstock was held August 19, 2009.
